In this session, 30-year CIA careerist Jon Nowick shares personal insights from his work as a CIA analyst, manager, overseas representative, and trainer of intelligence officers, including informing Presidents of events that shook the world. Jon Nowick served in the CIA from 1974-2006 as an intelligence analyst and manager focused on the Balkans and Eastern Europe and a detail to the Department of Homeland Security. Since 2006 he has been training CIA and other Intelligence Community officers in counterterrorism and collaboration.
